COUNTER TERRORISM POLICY

POLICY STATEMENT

As a not for profit organization operating in Australia and overseas, CWON recognizes there is a risk of CWON being misused by individuals or other organisations to support terrorist activity. CWON recognizes that this risk would be increased if CWON does not exercise appropriate oversight of the delivery and operation of the in-country projects it funds.

COUNTER TERROR RESPONSIBILITIES

- a) CWON acknowledges that Australian Government legislation prohibits dealing with listed terrorist organizations and/or proscribed persons or entities. CWON acknowledges its obligations under these laws and therefore will exercise all reasonable care and make every reasonable effort to ensure that its funds and program activities are not misused to further terrorism or support terrorist activities.
- b) CWON will confirm the identity, credentials and good standing of the people and organisations it supports and will check that these people or organisations are not on the prohibited lists maintained by the Australian Government.
- c) CWON will not knowingly remit any funds to known or suspected terrorist organisations or individuals.

- d) CWON will not remit any funds to an international organisation or person/s that has not been screened against a relevant database (such as LinkMatchLite or other database recommended by DFAT)
- e) CWON will report any known or suspected terrorist links to the relevant national authority.
- f) CWON will use its best endeavours to ensure that overseas recipients of CWON funds will adopt policies and procedures that enable them to comply with relevant Australian anti--terrorist legislation.
- g) CWON Board is committed to compliance with Australian anti--terrorist legislation to avoid dealing with individuals and organisations associated with terrorism. The Board is responsible for the review of this policy.
- h) CWON is responsible for distributing and explaining this policy to all CWON employees and partners and ensuring that they carry out the following procedures to minimise the risk of supporting terrorist organisations or individuals. This includes the induction process for new staff.
- i) CWON must know the identity, credentials and good standing of its partners and recipient organisations (i.e. what they do, where they operate, who are their key decision makers and staff). This procedure must also be followed in the selection process for new partners and projects.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

All individuals working for CWON AUST, whether paid or volunteer, will adhere to this policy and are responsible for ensuring their actions are in line with this policy. Such

individuals are also responsible for notifying the board if they believe this policy is not being followed.

POLICY REVIEW

This policy will be reviewed every two years, or more frequently as appropriate.

Representatives who have questions or concerns or require further information in relation to these policies and procedures should contact members of the board or the program supervisor, or where that is not practicable the President of CWON AUST.
